



WORK INSTRUCTION GOOD ENVIRONMENTAL PRACTICES FOR USERS

Our commitment with the preservation of the environment requires every user's collaboration. Please, consider the following recommendations:

WASTE management

- Place the waste in the designated areas. Never throw them into the water. There are containers for cardboard, plastic, glass and organic waste at the green point to facilitate a selective separation of the waste.
- Place all dangerous waste: batteries, fluorescent lights, oils, filters, gas cylinders..., in the designated containers for this purpose, or ask the seamen staff.
- There are containers for engine oils and a pick-up service for the bilge waters from the boats. This services can be requested in the club's offices.

CLEANING

- When you clean a boat, do not leave the water supply open unnecessarily, use a regulating device (hose pistol) as established by the internal Regulation in art. 64 A
- Use biodegradable soaps and detergents.

DISCHARGES

Carry out a periodic maintenance of the engines and the boat. Avoid fuel spillages, check the tanks and hoses to avoid leaks

- It is absolutely prohibited and firmly penalized to discharge any dangerous or polluting materials into the sea: paint, oils, fuels... In case of accidental spillage inform the MANAGEMENT immediately
- If you carry out repairs and maintenance afloat, extreme the precautions in order to avoid the spillage of toxic products into the sea
- During refuelling extreme the precautions in order to avoid spillages and drippings, in case a spillage into the sea takes place inform the Seamen immediately
- If the tanks overflows, clean the fuel with absorbent cloths, do not pour it into the sea by cleaning with a hose. Dispose of the dirty cloths in the designated dangerous waste containers
- It is not permitted to discharge the bilges and waste waters into the sea

During NAVIGATION

- Try to anchor in places where the underwater ground is not damaged
- Respect the seagrass and marine biota, both on the surface and on the ground. Extreme the precautions in the protected areas
- Comply with the regulation in navigation, signage, bans and fishing.
- Moderate your navigation and manoeuvre speed, you will save fuel

ATMOSPHERIC EMISSIONS

- Do not keep the engines on unnecessarily
- Limit the use of aerosols and toxic products, try to find products less aggressive with the environment
- Avoid disturbing noises during maintenance and cleaning works
